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FELTED, KNITTED SCARF

Felt scarf

The scarf is knitted from woolen yarn and felted in the washing machine.

Length and colors can be adapted to taste and preference. You can see more here, how to do it - you will find the recipe and procedure below

You will need:

I have used leftover yarn in different colours. But you need about 4 skeins of woolen yarn, preferably in different colours. I have used yarn from Sandnes - it just has to be not be superwash wool - it does not filter.



You do this:

The rings can be knitted in different sizes according to taste and preference. I have used stick no. 5.5 and have knitted the rings on circular needle.

Cast on 60 stitches (or the number you want) and knit 12 rounds of stockinette stitch. You close the last lap (after 11 laps). Staple ends.

You knit the next ring as above with the same number of stitches - but you make sure that the rings are knitted into each other at the same time. Insert the circular needle into the first ring and then knit the 12 rounds of stockinette stitch - then 2 rings are connected.

Continue like this until you have the desired length. Remember that wool yarn shrinks in the washing machine. I have 25 rings on this scarf.

When all ends are stapled and the scarf has the desired length, the scarf is felted in the washing machine together with a pair of jeans - 40 degrees for

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about 45 minutes - or whatever programs you have on the washing machine. And if you want to felt the scarf further, it can simply be washed again. Then it becomes even more firm.

Wrap a few turns around the neck.
