CROCHETED CONTAINERS / CANS - RECYCLING

Crocheted containers - recycling

Cute little storage containers - crocheted from leftover yarn and with a metal can from corn or similar. inside. Use them for beads, potted plants, the cotton pads in the bathroom, the children's little trinkets on the desk, pencils, etc., etc.



The colors can be mixed, mixed, matched according to mood and what they need to go with.

You will need:

Yarn scraps - cotton yarn, wooden beads or similar, sisal or other yarn for decoration, metal can from corn/peeled tomatoes or similar.

You do this:

Crochet 4 chain stitches (ch) and join them into a ring with a chain stitch (sl st). Alternatively, start with a magic ring if you know that technique.

2nd round: Crochet 6 double crochets in the ring (sc)

3rd round: Crochet 2 sc in each stitch - continue round out

4th round: Crochet 1 sc, 2 sc in the same stitch - continue round out

5th round: Crochet 2 sc, 2 sc in the same stitch - continue round out

6th round: Crochet 3 sc, 2 sc in the same stitch - continue round out

Continue to increase the number of stitches between each decrease by 1.

Continue crocheting rounds until you have a bottom that is SMALLER - about 0.5 cm all the way around - than the bottom of your metal can.

After this, do not take out - but crochet double crochets in each stitch. Continue this until the work has reached a height that fits the metal can. Finish the last round with a chain stitch - it gives a nicer finish.

Staple the ends and mount the work on the metal can. Decorate with coarse yarn and beads
