

BLOUSE WITH POCKET

Colorful knitted blouse with pocket

This knitted blouse with a pocket is colorful (red and purple sleeve, light blue on

back, lime green sleeve and

collar edges and a small light green pocket,

which looks forward to the front piece). The blouse

has a different structural pattern on it

front/back and sleeves. It is knitted in one

comfortable, soft yarn and has a fine

fit. The blouse is a size M/L. Stop by

For your knitted blouse with pocket, you need:

Red heart baby (Kvickly) 50g/190 m

4 keys light blue, 2 keys lime green, 3 keys navy blue, 2 keys purple, 2 keys red.

Circular needle no. 3 (knit back and forth)

Goal:

Chest width approx. 106 cm

Sleeve length: 47 cm

Full length: 58 cm

Knitting gauge: 25 stitches and 34 rows is 10 x 10 cm

Size: M/L

The back:

(light blue). Cast on 164 stitches on needle 3. Knit the pattern as follows: knit 1

edge stitch, *knit 3, purl 3* *= repeat the needle. Finish with an edge stitch, knit. Knit a total of 4 rows in this way, with knit over knit and purl over purl. The next 4 rows are knitted; Knit 1 edge stitch, purl 3, knit 3. Again, right must lie over right and wrong over wrong. These 8 stitches are repeated on the entire front piece and there appears

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"tern" in the structure.

Continue and knit straight up until the piece measures 38 cm. Then bind off for armhole on each side for 5,3,2,1,1 stitches over the next 10 rows (start each row with a bind off). There are now 140 stitches left on the needle. Knit straight up until the armhole measures 20 cm. Cast off the middle 54 stitches. Finish knitting each shoulder separately as follows: knit 2 rows straight up and then bind off the 43 stitches. Knit the other shoulder in the same way.

The front piece:

(dark blue).

Cast on 164 stitches on needle 3 and knit the same structure pattern as on the back. Knit straight up until the piece measures 10 cm. Then insert a marker thread as follows: knit until there are 55 stitches left on the needle, knit 24 stitches in garter stitch, knit the pattern needle out. Put any a marker thread before and after the 24 stitches for the pocket, which are knitted in garter stitch. These 24 stitches must be knitted straight on the next 8 rows (retrills) and must act as the top edge of the pocket. On the 9th row, bind off the 24 stitches over which the pocket spans (within the marking). Do not close too tightly. The other stitches are knitted all the time as usual structural pattern with the squares.

Pocket: Knit (on separate needles) with lime green a piece by itself as follows: Cast on 24 stitches and knit in garter stitch, so that there are 22 double crochets (44 needles). Break the yarn and let the work rest on the needle. On the next needle (with dark blue) on the front piece, knit up to the pocket at the closure and then knit the 24 green stitches into the work. Then continue straight up in the same structure pattern (the squares) and knit straight up to the armhole. Cast off for armhole in the same way as on the back. When the armhole measures 14 cm, cast off the middle 24 stitches. Then knit each side separately. Close in the neck side on every other needle for another 6,4,3,1,1 stitch. There are now 43 stitches on the needle. Knit straight up until the armhole has the same measurement as the back. Close off. Knit the other side in the same way with closures in the neck side.

Sleeve:

Cast on 63 stitches on row 3 and knit 9 rows garter stitch (with lime green). Change to red (on the other sleeve purple). Then knit the structure pattern as follows: 3 rows stockinette stitch, 4th row: knit 3, purl 3. These 4 stitches form the structure of the sleeve and are repeated throughout

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the way up. When increasing the sleeve, make sure that the 3 purl/3 purl overlap each other so that they lie in the same place all the way up the sleeve and do not shift. When the sleeve measures 5 cm, take out 1 stitch at the beginning and end of every 4th row until there are a total of 127 stitches. Then knit straight up until the sleeve measures 47 cm. Close - not too tight. Knit a similar sleeve with a green border at the bottom and the rest purple.

Shoulder seams, side seams are sewn together and then the neckline is knitted. The pocket is sewn to the back of the work. Make sure that the stitches you sew with do NOT fall over on the front side - only grab stitches on the back side.

Neckline:

Pick up approx. 117 stitches with circular needle 3/40 cm and purl 6 rounds with lime green. Change to light blue and knit 6 rounds. Then knit 1 round with light green and then purl 6 rounds (the first round with lime green is to avoid marking the purl needle when changing colour). Thus, the grooves are continued with garter stitch for light blue and 1 needle knit/6 row purl for lime green. The neckline can be continued until it has the desired waist (can also be made into a turtleneck) but I have 3 lime green grooves and 4 light blue grooves. Remember not to close the neckline too tightly.

Staple ends. The shirt is rinsed and tossed in the washing machine. Lay out to dry - for example on a foam mattress.
