

Crochet mobile cover owl

Cute and slightly different mobile bag like

can be crocheted in different sizes, so it fits your cell phone's

size. The color choice can also be varied and it can be crocheted from leftover yarn

(cotton). Click below - and you will get the recipe



You must use

Scraps, cotton yarn, eyes or buttons for eyes, crochet hook no. 3, button/pearl for nose

You do like that

Body: 40 air masks (or the number that fits the width of your mobile phone).

Crochet double crochets round and round until the body is the desired length.

Measure from your phone and remember a little extra for the bottom. Break the yarn and sew together at the bottom. Staple ends.

Lid: Crochet over 22 double crochets - back and forth (that is, slightly more than half the number of stitches you have around the width). Crochet 2 rows without a decrease. Then take 1 stitch in at each end (beginning and end) of each row. This is done by crocheting 2 double crochets together. See possibly instruction video on youtube or garnstudio.com. The decreases are continued until there is only 1 stitch left in the tip. Then crochet a loop (I have crocheted 6 chain stitches) and fasten the loop as a nose with a chain stitch. Staple ends. Each row is turned with 1 chain stitch.

Feet: 5 ch - 4 sc left of the row - the first sc in the 2nd ch from the hook.

Turn - then: (1 sc, in hst, 1 dc, 1 hst, 1 sc) in the same stitch - 1 sl st in the next stitch. Repeat 2 times on the foot. Break the yarn. Crochet a foot for the stomach. Sew the feet on at the bottom.

Wings: 2 ch, 3 sc in the 2nd ch, turn with a ch.

Always turn with 1 ch. after crochet row.

1 sc, 2 sc in the same st, 1 sc, etc. - end of the round.

2 sc, 2 sc. in the same st, - the round out

The number of sc between each increase is increased by 1 after each row - continue until there are 7 stitches between each increase. Make 2 wings similar to each other (semicircles). Sew them 1.5 cm inside the back of the mobile bag. Then fold over on the front like a wing.

Eyes: Can be crocheted as a ring and then put an eye (purchased) - down in the hole. Can also be crocheted in the round and then possibly a button or bead on. It's a bit of taste and pleasure. Sew on eyes and staple all ends.

Sew on a button as a beak (or pearl) - put where the flap is to close.
