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CROCHETED OWL

Crochet owl

A cute little owl - can be varied in many colors and patterns - you decide even. It can be crocheted in leftover yarn, if

you have something lying around. The owl here is

crocheted in cotton yarn and if you have

fancy, you can download the recipe for free

below.



Cotton yarn - possibly leftovers

Buttons for eyes

Crochet hook

You do this:

BODY:

1st round: 2 chain stitches (ch) - 6 double crochets (sc) in the

2nd ch. from the needle 2nd round: 2 sc. in each m.

3rd round: 1 sc, 2 sc in the next stitch - the

round out 4th round: 2 sc, 2 sc in the next stitch

- the round out 5th round: 3 sc, 2 sc in the next

stitch - the round out 6th round: 4 sc, 2 sc in the

next stitch - the round out



7th round: 5 sc, 2 sc in the next stitch - the

round out 8th round: 6 sc, 2 sc in the next stitch

- the round out 9th round: 7 sc, 2 sc in the next

stitch - the round out

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10th round: 8 sc, 2 sc in next stitch - end of round

11th round: 9 sc, 2 sc in next stitch - end of round

12-27 rounds: sc in each stitch without increases.

28 rounds: 9 sc, 2 sc together - end of round

29th round: 1 sc in each stitch without decreases

30th round: Change color and then 6 sc, 2 sc in the next stitch - round

out 31st round: 7 sc, 2 sc in the next stitch - round out

32nd round: 8 sc, 2 sc in next stitch - end of round

Round 33-41: sc in each stitch without increases

42 rounds: 7 sc, 2 sc together - end of round

43 rounds: 1 sc in each stitch - end of the round

44 rounds: 6 sc, 2 sc together - end of round

45 rounds: 7 sc, 2 sc. together - round out

Then fill the entire owl with cotton wool and press the hole together at the top - crochet together with double crochets.

FINGER:

1st row: 8 chain stitches, sc in the 2nd ch and then in the stitches of the row. Turn with 1 ch.

2nd row: 2 sc in 1st st 6 sc - turn with 1 ch (you do this after each row when you turn)

3rd row: 1 sc in each stitch

4th row 2 sc in the 1st st, 7 sc in the row.

Continue in this way, taking out at the beginning of every other row until you have crocheted 9 rows in total.

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10 row: 2 sc. together, sc in each st along the row

11 row: crochet back with sc in each st.

Row 12: 2 sc together, sc in each st along the row.

Continue the decreases on every other row until you have just one sc left on the row.

Crochet the other wing opposite with increases and decreases - it must be mirrored.

Around the wing, crochet a round of double crochets - remember to crochet 3 sc in the same st. when you turn the corner so that the corner does not curl. Sew on the wing

BEAK: 6 ch, sc in the 2nd ch and then sc across the row, turn with 1 ch

In the middle of the next row, crochet 2 sc together and otherwise 1 sc in the other sts. Turn with 1 ch.

This is how the decrease is continued on each row until there is just one

sc. back. EYES:

Crochet in the round - just like when you started the bottom of the owl.

The eye must be the size you want and then sewn on.

I used a button for the eyeball, but it can also be crocheted and sewn on. Crochet 2 eyes in total.

Can be crocheted in different sizes depending on how big you make the base and how high you want the owl. Stripes, colors and other things you mix yourself.
