# Coffee coasters for the table (small placemat) - patchwork

A small coffee piece that replaces the placemat on the living room table. A fantastic invention that dresses the table and takes up much less than a placemat. Practical and usable. Read more about how and find the free recipe here.



#### You will need:

Vlieseline (not too thin)

fabric in different patterns and colors

Sewing thread

#### You do this:

Make a template - a square measuring  $7 \times 7$  cm. Draw 8 pcs. squares on the fleece and cut out. Iron the fleece lining pieces onto the fabric you choose to use and cut out by 1 cm. seam allowance all around. Bend the seam allowance down and iron. The fleece lining forms the edge and you can feel where to bend over.

Continue like this on all 8 squares.

Sew the squares (4 pieces) together right-to-right with small stitches. Sewn by hand.

Iron vliesofix (double-adhesive) on a piece of fabric and cut out hearts. Then iron on the front of the coffee tray. Sew decorative stitches (stitches) up and down around the edge of the heart with a slightly coarse thread than sewing thread. Possibly embroidery thread or linen thread.

Do the same with the back - they will be the same on both sides.

Then place the 2 pieces of sewn squares together wrong sided and sew with fine stitches by hand all the way around the edge of the coffee tray. Press with an iron and it is then ready for use. Make the number of coffee beans you need in the same way as above. Good pleasure.
