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Shawl with fun crochet border

A slightly different shawl with a fun crocheted edge. You can keep warm, the shawl can also be used as a scarf, and then the shawl has its own expression with the slightly wild edge that is crocheted on.

Knitting needles no. 3

Crochet hook no. 3



Yarn consumption: approx. 750 meters in running length. Yarn corresponding to needles 3 - 3.5.

Edge - yarn: I have used 1 skein of stocking yarn, which changes color automatically. But edge color and yarn type are a matter of taste and preference.

You do this:

cast on 6 stitches on needle 3. The entire shawl is knitted in garter stitch. Take out 1 stitch on one side on every other needle until you have approx. 110 stitches on the needle......or until you reach the desired length of your shawl (note decreases are until half of the shawl is knitted). Then take 1 stitch into the same side on every other needle until you have 6 stitches left. Close off and staple ends.

The edge:

Crochet 1 round of double crochet all the way around the edge of the shawl. Then crochet 14 ch, 12 treble crochets in the 3rd stitch from the hook and close with a chain stitch (this forms the round dot at the end). Crochet then chain stitches left of the stem/chain stitches. Continue with double crochets between each stem and make a dot at the end of each stem. Repeat the round out.

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You can possibly moisten and press (not too hot - be careful) each dut with an iron......place if necessary cotton fabric in between. How hot the iron should be depends on the type of yarn. Try yourself a little.
