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CROCHET HAT AND SCARF - BOSHI STYLE

Crochet hat in boshi-style and "shredded" scarf.

Crochet hat and scarf. Both parts are crocheted in Peruvian highland wool, Filcolana. A delicious yarn that only gets softer with use. The technique is double crochets, air stitches and fixed stitches.



You will need: 8 skeins of Peruvian wool (run length approx. 100 m per 50 g) - 2 of each desired color. Crochet hook no. 5

You do this:

However, I have spiced up the hat with a tassel. A real hat has a tassel in my world - so it got it!

I made the neckerchief from strips of air mesh, which I tied together with a string/knots (a bit tight, so they don't slip apart). The air mask chains have a length of approx. 160 cm - but you can increase or decrease this as you wish).

You can vary the number of air mask chains as you wish - depending on how thick/thin you want your scarf to be. If I had a little more

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yarn, I would probably have made it a little thicker...so maybe you need a little more yarn.....but it's a matter of taste and preference.

The scarf is also a good method to get rid of various yarn scraps. It doesn't matter that the chain stitch chains are in different yarn qualities, thicknesses, etc. - as long as they are the same length.

The air mesh chains are finished with a knot at each end and then cut off with scissors - but you can also choose to fasten the ends with a needle - it gives a slightly more "straight" look.
