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PONCHO "SQUARE"

Poncho - model "square"

This poncho is composed of 4 large "Granny squares". And to finish, a neckline is crocheted. The model can be used by both adults and children and can be varied in countless sizes. Today, the poncho is completely worn out - but has also been used extensively. It was designed in the time when my website was called retvrang.dk - but the idea still holds.

You will need:

Yarn - can be varied in thick, thin, but it is important that the crochet hook and yarn thickness match. The principle of crocheting the poncho is the same - whether the yarn is thick or thin.



For this model I have used "Move" from BC Garn - suitable for crochet hook no. 3. 4 keys have been used for each of the colors orange, red, green and purple. In addition, 2 keys brown for the neckline.

Move from BC Garn has a running length of approx. 210 m/50 g.

You do this:

4 large granny squares/grandmother squares in each color must be crocheted. I have crocheted 28 rounds on my square from the center out. My poncho is a size XL, as it is intended for a tall girl, so maybe your square should be a little smaller - you have to measure yourself for that. In the last round I crocheted the squares together. You can also sew them together if you like it better. The

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poncho consists of a green square at the front, a purple square at the back and red/orange squares across the shoulders - you can mix and match as you like.

Below I have put a link to youtube videos, where you can see how to crochet granny squares, as well as how they can be crocheted together.

Neckline: The neckline is crocheted with brown yarn and you do this as follows:

The neckline is only crocheted over the sides (red and orange). Start in the middle of, for example, the red page.

1st round: 1 chain stitch (sl st) around a chain stitch (ch), 2 ch, 2 double crochets (dc) around the same ch - then 1 ch, 3 dc around the next ch - continue in this way with 3 dc around each ch to the corner/tip front and back. In the corner crochet 2 dc, in the next corner also crochet 2 dc (without a ch in between) - continue with 3 dc around each ch until you reach the next corner and crochet a similar corner. End the round with a km in 2nd ch

The following rounds: 3 ch, 2 dc around the ch, 1 ch, 3 dc around the ch - continue to the corner and crochet the corner in the same way as on the 1st round.

My neckline consists of 10 rounds where the corners are crocheted as described above. From approx. 11-20 are crocheted straight up - without corners - with 3 dc. around each ch.

Fasten the ends and the poncho is finished.
